ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY

As most of you know by now, Athenian Players Theatre is participating in Ohio's Adopt-A-Highway litter control program. APT has accepted responsibility for the cleanliness of a 2-mile stretch of State Route 50 just east of Athens, approaching and including Canaanville.

We have made a commitment to pick up litter on our section at least four times each year for two years. In exchange, the Ohio Department of Transportation has erected a sign at each end of our stretch, which indicates Athenian Players Theatre as the responsible group. This sign is seen by hundreds, if not thousands, of motorists

each day, giving APT a little more public notice.

So far this year we have conducted three clean-ups. The next (and final) one for this year is scheduled for Saturday, October 7th. All APT members are encouraged to help in this public service effort. Those who can will please meet at 8am at the intersection of State Route 50 (east of Athens) and County Road 24-A. Judging by our first three clean-ups, this should only take about two hours or so.

Athenian Players Theatre took A CHRISTMAS MEMORY (from the 1999-2000 season) to Regional OCTA Fest in Marietta in June, winning the honors for Excellence in Directing (Mark Mann) and Outstanding in Ensemble (Mark, Sylvia Abbott and

Michael Mazzocca). APT went on to the State OCTA Fest in **Toledo over Labor Day** weekend, again with success! With the off-stage voices and technical assistance of **Christine Neumann and Joe** Balding, our group won additional honors. Sylvia and Michael each won a certificate award for Merit in Acting, Mark received the award for **Excellence in Artistic** Directing, and the entire group was awarded the honors for **Outstanding in Ensemble** Performance.

In addition, Steve Haskins had entered his set design for NIGHT OF JANUARY 16th into competition and came home with the First Place trophy for Excellence in Set Design.

This was the first time APT had participated in State OCTA Fest, and only the second time for Regional (last year in Coshocton Pat Berry Fraze received the award for Merit in Acting for her portrayal of SHIRLEY VALENTINE, doing APT proud in our first OCTA Fest participation).

All APT members should give serious consideration to ioining in on the fun next year. State OCTA Fest will be hosted by the **Worthington Players over** Labor Day weekend at the Holiday Inn in Worthington, Ohio. This year about 500 community theatre people from around the state attended and had a ball (literally!). There were two days of play excerpts, many workshops covering many facets of theatre, parties, talent shows, auctions, parties, a parade, a Mardi Gras masquerade ball, parties.....did I mention parties?
