Theater in Aiken, SC

• by Marvin Bowman Editor's note: Marvin is a past president of APT and appeared in many of our shows (Flowers for Algernon, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Funny Girl, Wild Honey, Bedroom Farce, Night of January 16th, The Long Christmas Dinner, 1940's Radio Hour). He is now retired from Ohio University, but not from theatre, and living in Aiken, South Carolina.

A. Aiken Center for the Arts --October, the Center for the Arts held a fundraiser: "Tony n' Tina's Wedding". About 112 of the cast came from NY or elsewhere and the others were local. I played Uncle Luigi who had to rush to the bathroom in the middle of the wedding and I got to curse in Italian. This "Italian wedding" and reception was a wild interactive event with a drunk Irish Priest, gum-chewing pregnant maid of honor, fights, etc. Some of the NY cast had been doing this event off-Broadway for several years. It was wellreceived - over 650 people paid \$75 each. One of the cast parties was held at a prestigious location. You could tell that because the large house was on the corner lot of two dirt streets. One of the unique things about Aiken is the several dirt roads to protect the many steeplechase and polo horses that are in Aiken. The local Dogwood Stable had a horse in the last Kentucky Derby. Also, there is a Thoroughbred Hall of Fame here.

- B. Black Box -- On Halloween weekend, the Aiken Community Playhouse held a coffee house event with an open mic and readings. I was on this committee and we read from "The Monkey's Paw". We plan to do several more of this type of event in our rehearsal hall. This black box is about 30' X 50' space with basic lighting /sound and black curtains.
- C. Aiken Kidney Benefit -- AKB has been doing some musical event as a fundraiser for over 15 years. I helped with painting and moving stuff. They had to have at least 3 locations for rehearsals before they moved for the final week to the Aiken campus of the University of South Carolina. (Sound familiar?) This year they did "Annie Get

Your Gun" for four performances. I was to have had a small non-singing (of course) role but a schedule conflict arose with the next ACP play.

D. Aiken Community Playhouse -appeared in the "Out of Order" British Farce in November. We had a good run of five performances. We were to have had seven performances but the lead was in the hospital with a bleeding ulcer. We rehearsed with the director on book but there was not enough time for him to get the blocking/timing. This Ray Cooney play (he has done several that have many of the same elements and even some of the same lines) is very dependent on pacing. Lots of comings and goings, window slamming, dead body, and my pants are pulled down, etc. Neither the Playhouse (in 52 years) nor myself (in X years) had been involved in a cancellation. The audience was given a pass for a future show and those that made it to the theater were given free wine and cheese. The Board Members had called most people for the final "sold out" performance.

Olcott Update

Editor's note: Past APT member, one-time Facilities Coordinator and many-times actor Neil Olcott (I'm About to Develop an Attitude, Working, Death of the Old Man, Black Comedy, Flowers for Algernon, Baby, Squabbles) has since moved to Florida with his wife Kuei-mei Liu. Neil recently emailed that he's keeping busy:

"...Incidentally, I don't know if I've shared with you that I got a supporting role in Tom Stoppard's "Arcadia," to be put on in March and April by Mad Cow Theater in Orlando, a professional company. It's nice to be able to say I'm gonna get paid for it for once, though the stipend won't even pay my gas and parking to schlep up there (75 mile round trip each time I go)."
